State Officials Warn Consumers: Beware, IRS Phone Scams Still Active

Tips to Protect Yourself Against Frauds and Scams, Identity Theft and Reduce Spam Email

- Don't use or carry a checkbook.
- Sign up on the **Do Not Call List**.
- Sign up to **block credit card offers**.
- Don't carry your Social Security card with you.
- Don't give out any financial information to a stranger.
- Don't put outgoing mail in or on your mailbox.
- If regular bills fail to reach you, call the company to find out why.
- Don't respond to unsolicited e-mail (Spam).
- Don't click on contacts, pictures or files in an unsolicited e-mail.
- Don't respond to e-mail claims that you have won a prize, when you did not enter a contest.
- Use good anti-virus and anti-adware software.
- If it seems too good to be true ... IT IS!

These are all in addition to the unsavory litany of familiar scams, such as predatory lending, phishing, “credit repair” services, numerous fundraising letters from Africa, and [home-repair fraud](#).
